

Newborn found at bus stop

VANCOUVER – Vancouver police are investigating after a two to three-day-old baby was found abandoned at a bus stop over the weekend.

A woman was waiting at a bus stop on King Edward Avenue on Saturday when she noticed a large plastic bag.

Vancouver Police spokesperson, Const. Anne Drennan says when the bag started moving, the woman looked inside, and found the baby girl.

"It's very unusual in Vancouver to have a story like this where you have an abandoned baby where we just have absolutely no idea where the baby might have come from," she says.

Drennan says police believe the baby had been there for about an hour.

Police say they want to find the parents, because the girl may be suffering from an unidentified medical condition. But she adds the baby is in generally good condition.

"We're asking that the parents of this child come forward, as obviously they would be the most appropriate ones to provide us with background information that could help the hospital staff with the most effective treatment for the baby."

A woman wearing a black jacket with hood was seen walking away from the bus stop. Drennan says she is white, 30-35 years old and driving a light four-door car.

Drennan says the parents should not be afraid to come forward – noting police only want what's best for the abandoned child.
